







Veterans Day Ceremony

It will be fitting that we ride through this arch to deliver our Check to establish the Sgt Ryan James Connolly Memorial Scholarship. The Scholarship will be open to Veterans and/or their family members that are full or part time students at SRJC in the Industrial Trade & Technology discipline.

Taken from Sgt Connolly's obituary; "He enjoyed all things mechanical, including working on cars and motorcycles. While in Afghanistan, Ryan rebuilt an old Soviet motorcycle in order to ride around camp."



Neil Diamond in Vietnam by Kim Crumb



In March of '71 our unit was participating in Operation Lam Son 719. Set up on a small Observation Post near the Ashau, there were two 81mm mortar teams, three of us running the 'Fire Direction Center,' and a rifle platoon from Alpha. One afternoon, one of the platoon's squads going out on a night ambush patrol came over to our FDC bunker to ask one of us to accompany them as the Forward Observer for the mortars. We'd been on the O.P. for a couple of weeks or so, not much had happened, and I was bored. I'd served as an F.O. on a couple of occasions, my two buddies weren't jumping at the offer, so, with Twenty-four pound 'Prick 25' radio, and my rifle in hand, I went along.

Just before dusk we set up near a small stream a klick or so from the O.P. The only thing that caught our attention that night were mosquitos, a small tiger (aka a 'Banana Cat') meandering by, and a little group of wild pigs. One of the guys in the squad, 'Tex', was a machine gunner from Texas. Raised on a ranch, he really wanted one of the pigs to supplement our c-ration diet. But, cooler heads prevailed. To keep things from getting interesting, at odd intervals I called in a half-dozen mortar rounds on defensive targets around us. An hour after dawn we headed back to our little hill for a c-ration 'breakfast' and some much needed sleep. Once we reached the base of the O.P., I volunteered to lead the way up the narrow little path to the two man Night Defensive Position protecting the hill from unwanted visitors.

A half-dozen or so meters from the NDP, one of the two guys softly called, "halt, who goes there?" I stopped, answering with the code name for our squad along with the day's password. The same guy replied with the backup password, to which I gave the correct backup response. Sometimes, there would be a follow up question to which only an American soldier would know the correct answer. In this case, instead of telling me to 'come on in', he asked, "who won the Series last year?" This caught me by surprise. I had never been a sports enthusiast. The last time I had followed baseball, football, or basketball had been in high school. Squatting down at the edge of the trail, I thought for a moment. My lack of sports knowledge, plus what my 'rock and roll' loving buddies considered to be my equally 'odd' taste in music, was well known. Once again exhaling to keep my voice from hissing, I answered, "Neil Diamond." I heard a soft snicker followed by, "hey KC, come on in."

Neglected field, forgotten Veterans

On October 20th, members of Post 111, 579th Engineering Battalion, Sonoma County Sheriff's office and Shilo Cemetery, added and replaced the headstones of seventeen (17) Veterans who were buried in the Potters field of the Santa Rosa Rural Cemetery.

Ron Collier initiated this project to recognize unclaimed Veterans buried at this site which has been used by Sonoma County since 1968.

There will be a public ceremony to honor these Veterans by the Sotoyome Post Honors Team which will be scheduled before the end of this year.
