August 8<sup>th</sup> is the monthly meeting at the Annex. At this meeting we will be having several of the Boys and Girls State attendees will talk about their life changing experiences. This year the Post sponsored 9 boys and the Auxiliary sponsored 4 girls from Healdsburg and Windsor High Schools. The stories that they share are usually well worth hearing. It is great to see their excitement about what they learned: the process of election, campaigning, holding office and the art of compromise. We hope that they are the future for better government and programs. We have invited some local dignitaries and hope they will attend. Please come to the meeting, hear some great stories, socialize, and have a nice dinner. We will be needing help for the dinner, so come early to help set up, cook, and clean up.

Congress has passed two very necessary bills for Veterans. One is the Legion Act, Senate Bill S.504, that President Trump is expected to sign. It moves the dates for joining the American Legion back to December 7, 1941. It eliminates the gap of the cold war time when Veterans, who served during this time, were not eligible to join the American Legion. Now no Veteran will have that date problem and will be able to join our great organization. If you know anyone who was not able to join before due to this time era restriction, sign them up or have them call me. They deserve and can now enjoy all the benefits that the American Legion can offer.

The other bill passed in the 2019 National Defense Authorization Act, which addresses who can use the commissary on bases. They extended this right to veterans with **any** service-related disability, instead of only 100% disability, and any POW, and all caregivers. This will also apply to the Coast Guard Facilities. If you use a credit card for purchases, there will be a transaction fee added for its use.

We held our annual 4<sup>th</sup> of July fire works show at the Healdsburg High School this year and if you missed it, then you missed the best show ever and the best show around the State of California. What was disappointing is the lack of help for the night of the event. We should have had at least another 10 people helping collect donations and helping with all that goes on during the afternoon and night. Legionnaires, we are in this together for all the events. I do understand why some of you cannot do fireworks and were out of town with other commitments, but those of you who could have been at the show, you should have been there, and you were needed. You are always needed at every event. Most of us who do all the work (STP) for all the events are getting older, slower and some a little less healthy. Please provide whatever help you can at any event.

August 2, 2019 is Coast Guard Day and the Coast Guard, at the Two Rock Base, is having a 229<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration. We are invited to be on site to greet and thank the Coast Guard for their service. It is also a good time and place to tell them about the American Legion and how they need to be members to protect our rights as Veterans. 


#### SAL Commander Duke Callahan

July 24, 2019

Members of the Sotoyome Honor Team along with American Legion Riders from Chapters 111 and 83 from Petaluma, attended the Veterans Village Dedication.

The project will provide 60 one and two-bedroom apartments in six residential buildings, ranging in size from 700 to 850 square feet, as well as a community room, a service center and outdoor recreation space. Services offered will include employment and job training, behavioral health treatment, intensive case management, daily living classes, family reunification and peer support.

It is anticipated the project will take a year to complete.
