


Christmas Dinner December 14, 2017

At 9:30 a.m. an observance at the Santa Rosa Veterans Memorial Building was held to recall the attack of Dec. 7, 1941, that drew the U.S. into World War II. In the North Bay and across the country, most of the sailors, Marines and soldiers who survived the aerial assault have passed.

Where remnants of the former Pearl Harbor Survivors Association still convene, the widows typically outnumber the veterans.

At the ceremony, a small bell was struck and names were read for each of the Pearl survivors who lived out their lives in the North Bay.

The Sotoyome Honor Team presented and retrieved the colors during the ceremony.




