

the site to interview our own **Ron Collier** for the Jefferson Award. Ron has received this award for his tireless dedication on behalf of Veterans whose cremated remains have been unclaimed. Ron spends many hours researching the names and locating the remains of Veterans who have not, for whatever reason, been claimed by their family. Due to Ron's efforts, our fellow Veterans get a full military burial in the National Cemetery for their final farewell. We can all thank **Steve Bowne** for nominating Ron for this award. The

news network saw the value in the cause and Ron's efforts. Hopefully, it will provide more attention to MIAP and our unclaimed Veterans. The program will be aired on Channel 5's 6 PM newscast May 23, 2018, so mark your calendars to watch the broadcast. We are planning a pizza party at the annex for all to watch as a group. Please try to attend and have some free pizza and celebrate Ron.

For those who are not aware of what MIAP is, there are approximately 70,000 unclaimed Veterans across the country sitting on shelves of mortuaries, morgues, and funeral homes, unclaimed by family. Some do not have any remaining family. MIAP claims these Veterans' remains and provides a proper and deserved military burial for their final farewell. Ron is responsible for seeing them laid to rest properly.

I attended the ALR Department of California convention in Oceanside, CA. on April 20th - 22nd, riding down with **Ed Doitteau**. It was a great riding experience for Ed, a new motorcycle rider. There is nothing like riding on the Los Angeles freeways to gain a lot of knowledge riding in traffic. The convention was a success with about 350 riders attending. The American Legion Riders throughout California rode more than 1.1 million miles last year attending different Veterans events, raising awareness of Veterans' needs and raising over \$100,000 to help fill those needs.

"Family First" 2018 National Theme

I recently spent 17 days in Maryland, and the nearby areas, with my children and grandkids. An early stop was to Arlington National Cemetery to pay our respects to my wife Karen's folks. Her father **GySgt Raymond Latocki**, USMC, was laid to rest after surviving service in WW II, Korea and Vietnam. He made it home without any immediate injuries, but contracted brain cancer directly attributed to exposure to Agent Orange and died in 1992. Her mother Phyllis passed away at age 91 and in November 2017 joined him. We were there with "Family" to honor her and his service. On this trip I had plenty of time to read and had brought with me a



book by Michael Archer, "The Long Goodbye". My sister had worked with Michael in Nevada and I had met him a few years ago and read his fist book, "A Patch of Ground – Khe Sanh Remembered." During my service with the USMC I spent time in 1969 at Quang Tri, Viet Nam only 60 miles from Khe Sanh. While I did not see as much action as Michael did during the siege of Khe Sanh, his description of the camp life between attacks rang a familiar note, so I bought copies for all of my kids and Michael signed them. I enjoyed the book and had decided to read his new one, "The Long Goodbye – Khe Sanh Revisited". It is well written and chronicles Michael's efforts to find out what happened to his friend and fellow Marine that did not come home. The saga brought up the complication of Missing in Action



(MIA) versus Killed in Battle but body not recovered. A tragedy of significant proportions for the "Family" due to all the unknowns. I finished the book and began thinking about my Father's service in WW II. I happened to be in a thrift store with my daughter and found a copy of "Flags of our Fathers" by James Bradley. I had seen the movie but had not read the book. The author is the son of the Navy Corpsman that was one of the 6 to raise the flag at Iwo Jima. Much like in 'The Long Goodbye', he takes us through the lives of the 6, which includes their service before and after that iconic moment in time. He also does a great job documenting the contribution of families and the impact on the collective community. He wrote the book after his father died, in part because he had not known much about his Father's service until he started going through his father's memorabilia stashed away in boxes. All this peaked my interest and curiosity about my Father's service in WW II. About all I knew is that my father served in the Navy in the South Pacific and repaired diesel engines on boats. I had a copy of his

DD 214 which gave minimal information but I found a number of his ship assignments on Ancestry.com. As I dug further I found that he had served with the Seventh Amphibious Force, most notably known by the famous quote by General MacArthur, "I Shall Return". During my search I found a book written by Vice Admiral Daniel E. Barbey, "MacArthur's Amphibious Navy – Seventh Amphibious Force Operations 1943-1945". My Father was assigned to the "Seventh" for most of this period. In reading this book I now have a clearer picture of where my father was and what he was a part of.

Yes, I have bought several copies of the book and given them to "Family" to read, with special attention to chapter 7, 'Planning First Combat Operations'. It is important to acknowledge the role of the "Family" as it relates to military service. Our fore fathers, those that are serving now, and those that may be called to service. It is never too late to acknowledge and document this service. A Memorial is not much without the details of the memories.

ALR Convention 2018 Oceanside




There are moments in one's life where anxiety, excitement, wonderment and fear all come together! That moment was realized when I fired up my Harley for the southbound journey to Oceanside, San Diego!

The air was chilling but exhilarating as I rode off to meet with Tim Madura our Legion Commander. The guidance from a seasoned rider was invaluable and reassuring... until; "Go ahead Ed lead the way"! Yikes! So, inside I mustered the courage and WILL to take on the challenge. As I once read, "Fear is the brains way of saying that there is something important for me to overcome"!

I knew that heading down to this event symbolized more than just a ride, but it would represent everything that I stood for in support of our veterans and our Post 111. As a delegate, it was important for me to represent us and the values we stand for.

The ride for over 690 miles into LA County was uneventful; it seemed as if God had sent Angels to surround us from harm as we trekked into the 405 even



as we maneuvered our way through uncharted paths as nightfall came upon us.



We finally made it to our first leg of our journey to Chadsworth where Tim's family greeted us with open arms as if coming home from a battle. They had no idea that the battle of fear was within me. As it turned out, the convention was very regimented and choreographed just as I

experienced during my tenure in the Navy twenty-five years ago.

The greatest take away from this whole experience was the one on one conversations I had with many of the veterans of various branches of services. I gained more understanding, respect and privilege knowing that these men and women were among us. There was a raw sense of patriotism that only a room full of warriors and veterans can exude.

I am so grateful to be part of the American Legion Riders and I encourage more people to openly share what lies within your heart; even if it's fear.


